### WHAT TOOLS ARE NEEDED TO WORK WITH THIS MATERIAL?

Hand saws and power saws, for cutting, coming in different shapes and sizes according to the cutting purpose they're used for.

A work bench and sawhorses are used by woodworkers for most of their hand work. Planes: for shaving off wood fibres, for shaping and smoothing.

Sanders : for smoothing, polishing, or cleaning. Hammers, mallets, drills and screw guns are used for assembling.

Square and tape measures for measuring and marking, etc.

Carding Comb used to separate and align protein fibres; Spinning Wheel; Drop spindle; Weaving Looms; Yarn bobbins; Felting needles; Knitting needles; Needle felting mat; Embroidery hoops; Crochet hooks, pots, spoons, bowls, Fabrics, wool and woollen threads, scissors, curved rulers, pins, measuring tapes.

### WHAT TOOLS ARE NEEDED TO WORK WITH THIS MATERIAL?


Blowpipe to shape the glass with the help of a punty (or mandrel), bench, marver, blocks, jacks, paddles, tweezers, newspaper pads, and a variety of shears. Cane and murrine (rods cut in cross-sections to reveal patterns), torch/lamp, lathe and wheel, cutters, grinders, drills.
















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
